**Photographs of 179,400 tracts destined to
Nicaragua, Honduras, and Venezuela**



The 179,400 tracts on tables in Room 109 of the West Broward Church of Christ building, Plantation, Florida. Sept. 16, 2021.

On the left, those for Nicaragua and Honduras.

To the back, tracts and a small part of the medicines, etc. on hand to be shipped to Venezuela.



A closer view of most of the tracts.

On the left, the ones for Venezuela, and some of the 141 Bibles going in this shipment.

On the tables to the right, 129,000 tracts for evangelists and congregations in Nicaragua and Honduras.



50,400 tracts and 141 Bibles in 10 boxes to be shipped to evangelists and congregations in Venezuela.

Nine different titles. Approximately equal quantities of each in each box.

It took me about 2 hours to divide the tracts in quantities for each box and place them in the boxes, together with the Bibles.

These 10 boxes are part of a much larger shipment to Venezuela of food,

medicines, health aids, clothes, and shoes to be packed today, September 18, 2021, by a group of West Broward church volunteers under the supervision of Antonio.



The 7 boxes in this photograph are filled with 129,000 tracts. Six are full; one, about half full.

It took me 7 hours to arm the boxes, jog the packs of tracts, count the packs of tracts, and determine how many for Nicaragua and how many for Honduras. Then, place them in the boxes.

These tracts are of 20 different titles. Of a total of 28 in Spanish we presently have available.

Individually wrapped sets of books, booklets, and CDs of hymns are to be added to this shipment, plus perhaps more tracts.

The boxes, of very strong cardboard, measure 20 x 20 x 20 inches. In the back, left corner,

three flat boxes are laying on top of 2 full boxes already sealed. A full box of only tracts weights, I calculate, about 140 pounds. They will be picked up by the shipping company.



Another hour of putting sacks of clothes and shoes under the tables, taking contributed products out of bags and boxes, and separating them in categories -some not seen to the right- and this is how I left Room 109 for a large quantity of food to be brought today to the room and the packing to be done.

Ideally, eight workers are sufficient given the size of the room and the procedures for packing. The

danger COVID-19 poses is also a factor.

Your continued interest and support make all these works possible and we feel blessed and honored to play a part in them.
