The Barinas congregation meets in a theater. Capital of the state of Barinas, the city has a population of about 360,000. Due to the present situation in Venezuela, many of the 600 member Barinas church are in need of food, medical supplies and clothes. 19 boxes of supplies, including some 40,000 tracts, prepared at the West Broward church building, Plantation, Florida, are scheduled to be delivered there in January, 2019. **David Sosa** is another evangelist working with the Barinas church.

CD's being produced

4 CD's of Antonio's hymns in Spanish. 1 of an excellent sermon, "Citizenship in Heaven," in Spanish, by Jesús Germán, of the Gurabo, Puerto Rico church. 819 shipped. About 300 on hand.



Left. The **CD duplicator** is the machine between the two printers. It makes 7 copies in about 3 minutes.

Each blue and white spindle has 100 blank CD's. **Right. Front.** The five CD's, each with its own distinctive label and envelope. **Back.** Stacks of packs of five CD's each. I attach the labels and insert the CD's in envelopes while the duplicator is making copies. Can also have the printers functioning at the same time. Additional titles are projected. We have the equipment for audio recording, and I have recorded two short messages. This is the initial step of adding much more audio material to our Internet site, as well as making it available on CD's. Always relying on God's grace and guidance.

Park Gardens Church of Christ, San Juan, Puerto Rico. For their "Open House" evangelistic outreach project, Saturday, Nov. 17, 2018, brethren of this congregation requested we prepare tracts and CD's for them. A total of 8,945 tracts and 128 CD's were sent, almost all copies with local data included. Expenses were covered by the church. 100 attended the activity, 11 being visitors. Distribution of the tracts continues. The Park Gardens Urbanization is where we first began work in Puerto Rico, May 2, 1966.

The following document on "**Venezuela benevolence**," a project under the oversight of the elders of the West Broward, Plantation, FL Church of Christ, was prepared by Antonio and is being sent as an E-mail to churches of Christ in the US. The 32 boxes in one of the pictures have already arrived at their destinations in Venezuela. Eighteen days is the usual time delivery takes. If your congregation has unassigned benevolent funds, may we humbly suggest the very serious and ongoing needs of brethren in Venezuela.

Venezuela Benevolence



The [West Broward Church of Christ](#) in Plantation, Florida would like to raise your awareness of benevolence work that is needed in Venezuela and respectfully requests that your congregation consider a donation to help continue benevolence there.

My name is Antonio Shappley, and I have the honor of serving as a Project Manager in our [Venezuela Benevolence Mission](#). On behalf of our Elders, I would like to raise your awareness of the mission, and request your consideration to help fund more good works there.



Any level and type of funding would be greatly appreciated by the brethren in Venezuela, whether a one-time contribution towards benevolence, or a commitment to help on a longer term basis.

The Church of Christ has more than 150 congregations in Venezuela. Most Ministers, Evangelists and Elders are severely hampered in their work for the Church, due to lack of funding for transportation, food, and evangelistic material. Some of our brethren are malnourished and most of the sick cannot afford medications, due to inflation of more

than 1,000,000% this year, compounded by mismanagement of the country overall. Since October (to God be the glory!) our congregation has been able to send more than 7,500 lbs of aid, including 200,000 evangelistic tracts, 200 water filters, and more than 40 large boxes of clothing. We have a database of more than 70 ministers and evangelists of the Church, and a reliable way to get funding into their hands, for them to purchase medications, pay for transportation, and food for their congregations and needy members of the community. Due to our location in South Florida, we have access to shipping companies at a rate of \$15 per cubic foot, delivered to all but a few remote areas of Venezuela, and more than 130 boxes have been delivered so far without incident. For \$100, a box can be delivered to feed a family of 4 for two weeks, along with several hundred evangelistic tracts to help that family spread the Gospel of Salvation to their community. So much more could be done if the funding for this ministry were to increase. So far, it's all been done through special contributions

by our congregation and a few others in the South Florida area, in addition to two congregations in Puerto Rico.

Would you please consider funding this benevolence mission to Venezuela? A commitment of monthly funding would be best, but if such commitment is not possible at this time, one-time contributions will be a great blessing to the work.
